**Liu, Chiao-Ann and her associates were indicted for
solicitation of prostitution**

Ms. Dai intended to solicit prostitution cross borders. Starting from 2000 to Oct., 2015, she lured 11 women to prostitute in casinos and hotels in the U.S.A., Europe, Australia, Japan, H.K., and Macao. She ordered airplane tickets, contacted whoremasters, and accompanied those women to provide sexual services, both domestically and abroad, in exchange for commissions between NT10,000 to NT300,000 dollars.

Ms. Chun intended for the same offense. From April, 2014 to Sep., 2015, she solicited 3 women to prostitute in Singapore, H.K., Macao, and Taiwan. She ordered airplanes tickets, contacted whoremasters, and accompanied those women to provide prostitution services, in exchange for commissions between NT40,000 and NT60,000 dollars.

Liu Chiao-Ann, conspired with Ms. Chun, assisted the whoremasters to pick prostitutes, accompanied those prostitutes to foreign countries to provide sexual services, supervised the safety of the prostitutes and the interactions with the whoremasters, and reported to Ms. Chun, in order to profit from the commissions of prostitution.

The crimes described above are in violation of §231 of the Criminal Act. Ms. Chun and Ms. Liu are codefendants. Their behaviors, however, can't apply the Anti-human trafficking Act for the reason that those women agreed to prostitute, were not restricted in liberty, and were not forced to involve in sexual transaction.
