## International Cultural Educational Foundation

### arranged 58 high-cared students to visit Taipei District

#### **Prosecutor Office**

Our office, joined by Taipei Honorary Probation Officers Association, cordially invited 58 highly-cared students from the International Cultural Educational Foundation (hereinafter, "ICEF") to enjoy a one-day visit to this office on July 11, 2016. This visit has provided them with a lively legal education on this summer vacation.

Owing to rather scarce familial resource, underprivileged families tend to submerge in the circulation of poverty, and are easily tempted by crimes due to their economical vulnerability. Hence, supports and involvement from social resources are urgently at stake, especially during summer vacation. While lacking of proper leisure activities, underprivileged children and youngsters become the apparent targets aimed by criminal organizations. Our office, together with ICEF and Taipei Honorary Probation Officers Association jointly arranged this visit, in hopes of correcting children's legal cognition, as well as keeping them away from illegitimate narcotics.

In this visit, the highly-cared children were allowed to enter the investigation rooms, identification rooms, and detention cells. Moreover, via the moot court presentation and pop quiz giveaway, children learned how the legal procedure worked, obtained the sense of human right protection, established them the correct legal

concepts, and enhance their consciousness as a citizen. After having renowned Taiwan Railway lunchbox, the children were further arranged to go to Winnie the Pooh Exhibition hosted by United Daily News Group.

The Chief Prosecutor Tsai also came in person and had a conversation with these children. In this kid-version judicial reform convention, these children were given the opportunities to share their ideal judicial systems with the Chief Prosecutor.
