Taipei District Prosecutor Office is investigating the Kuo Private Investigation Firm and other suspects for violation of the Anti-Corruption Act

The Kuo Private Investigation Firm(國〇徵信有限公司) and The Yi Private Investigation Firm's(一〇徵信有限公司) owner Zhoa and staffs bribed police by offering NT \$ 4000-8000 for alleged sale of the data of residence, vehicle registration, labor and health insurance, immigration records and other personal information from November 2012 to February 2014. They are suspected of violating the Anti-Corruption Act (貪污治罪條例) and the Data Protection Act.(個人資料保護法)

After gathering proof that seemed to corroborate the accusations, a team led by prosecutor Tsai, Wei-Yi(蔡偉逸) conducted searches on 3 June 2014 at 13 locations where the offices and residences of the suspects, included Taipei City, New Taipei City, Keelung County, Taichung City, Changhua City and Chiayi County . The team included officials from the Criminal Investigation Bureau Crime Prevention and Detection Commanding Center Central Branch and New Taipei City Police Department Banqiao Precinct.

26 criminal suspects and persons of interest were interviewed by investigators, in order to clarify the relevant facts in this case.
