Master key information and timely report in order to investigate Taipei District Prosecutor Office holds an educational training on the "Keys to Handling Reports and Election Bribery Information Inquiry"

In order to ensure the smooth process of accepting public reports of election bribery, to facilitate the master of key election bribery information, and to strengthen the bribery investigation mechanism of timely notification, rapid verification, and strict investigation, Chief Prosecutor Lin of Taipei District Prosecutors Office specially appointed Gao Yi-shu, Head Prosecutor to be in charge of the education and training conducted for colleagues who were responsible for accepting calls to report election bribery information on the morning of the 12th, with a view to making comprehensive preparations to do a good job in the work of investigating bribery and curbing violence in this election.

The registration of the candidates for the nine-in-one local public office election has been completed on September 2, and the local election commissions will draw lots on October 21. As the election polling day approaches, various election activities are in full swing. To prevent vote buying with cash or money substitutes such as gifts, meal coupons, home appliances, or receptions, travel and other disguised bribery methods, In addition to continuing to go to the front line to hold discussions with police and investigators, Chief Prosecutor Lin also asked all the units spread informants widely and comprehensively publicizes the public to

report bribery.

The focus of this education and training is to enable the on-duty personnel to understand the inquiry skills and essentials of various election bribery crimes, and to be able to quickly guide the public to tell the key points of the reporting of election bribery facts when answering the public's reporting calls or reporting through other technological communication devices, and report them in a timely manner in order to investigate illegal crimes such as bribery strictly.

Taipei District Prosecutors Office appeals to the public to report bravely when encountering or knowing about election bribery. The identity of the informant is kept strictly confidential. In addition, the public reports election bribery, and those who are found to be bribed can get up to NT\$10 million in bonuses. And after being prosecuted by the prosecutor, you can first receive a quarter of the bonus. If you are found guilty in the first or second instance, you will receive another quarter of the bonus. If you are finally convicted, you will receive the remaining half of the bonus.
