Taipei District Prosecutors Office

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Taipei District Prosecutors Office investigated Tien ○ Ai Company selling counterfeit drugs and concluded the investigation today (9th), filing prosecution and requesting the court to confiscate illegal gains of NT\$1,664,410. Brief details are as follows :

I. This case was investigated by Criminal Investigation Division of the Taipei City Police Department, in cooperation with the Department of Health, Taipei City Government and Taoyuan City Department of Health, under the direction of Prosecutor Wu Chi-Wei.

i. Investigation Results

The defendants Zhu ○-Qing, Bai ○-Wen, and Huang ○-Wen are all alleged to have committed the offense of selling counterfeit drugs in violation of Article 83, Paragraph 1 of the Pharmaceutical Affairs Act.

The defendant Tian ○ Ai Herbal Biotechnology Co., Ltd. (hereinafter referred to as “Tian ○ Ai Company”) is also alleged to have committed the same offense, as its responsible person, namely defendant Zhu ○-Qing, conducted business operations on its behalf. Accordingly, pursuant to Article 87 of the Pharmaceutical Affairs Act, the company shall be subject to a fine of up to ten times the penalty prescribed under Article 83, Paragraph 1 of the same Act.

ii. Brief Facts of the Prosecution

From October 7, 2022, Zhu ○-Qing, Bai ○-Wen, and Huang ○-Wen obtained, through Chen ○-Juan, the ingredients and formula proportions of “Purifying Extract,” “Qi-Nourishing Extract,” and “Body-Tonic Extract,” in the 【愛小月】 product series, as well as “Slimming Extract,” and “Beauty Extract” in the 【月經調理】 product series. They then commissioned related pharmaceutical manufacturers to produce the finished products.

Thereafter, Zhu ○-Qing, Bai ○-Wen, and Huang ○-Wen sold the products to consumers under the name of “Tien ○ Ai Company” through the official website

established by Fei o Wo Integrated Marketing Co., Ltd. (registered under Huang o-Wen's name), as well as through MOMO, PChome, Shopee, and other sales channels.

They required customers to comply with the treatment sequence and also claimed medical effects on the 【愛小月】 product introduction page, stating that the products could help women who had experienced miscarriage completely discharge lochia. In addition, they also required customers to follow certain sequences of consumption for the 【月經調理】 products in order to achieve menstrual regulation effects.

The Ministry of Health and Welfare determined, based on the medicinal ingredients listed on the packaging of "Purifying Extract," "Qi-Nourishing Extract," "Body-Tonic Extract," "Slimming Extract," and "Beauty Extract," as well as the results of its examination, that "Purifying Extract" and "Slimming Extract" were modified formulas of the standard Sheng Hua Tang (生化湯) prescription, while "Qi-Nourishing Extract," "Body-Tonic Extract," and "Beauty Extract" were modified formulas of the standard Shi Quan Da Bu Tang (十全大補湯) prescription. Accordingly, all of these products were deemed to be drugs as defined in Article 6, Paragraph 1, Subparagraph 1 of the Pharmaceutical Affairs Act.

After the above products were determined to be drugs, the Ministry of Health and Welfare, through the Public Health Bureau of the Miaoli County Government, issued a notice in November 2024 requiring Fei o Wo Integrated Marketing Co., Ltd. to remove the counterfeit drug products from the market, and further informed the company that the products should be regulated in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Pharmaceutical Affairs Act. Subsequently, on November 28, 2024, the Department of Health of the Taipei City Government conducted an inspection at Tien o Ai Company's office located in Zhongshan District, Taipei City, and expressly recorded in the inspection report that Tien o Ai Company had violated Article 83 of the Pharmaceutical Affairs Act by selling counterfeit drugs.

Although Zhu o-Qing, Bai o-Wen, and Huang o-Wen knew on November 28, 2024, that "Purifying Extract," "Qi-Nourishing Extract," "Body-Tonic Extract," "Slimming Extract," and "Beauty Extract" had been determined by the Ministry of Health and Welfare to be drugs, and that these products constituted counterfeit drugs under Article 20, Paragraph 1, Subparagraph 1 of the Pharmaceutical Affairs Act because no drug permit licenses had been obtained in accordance with Article 39 and related regulations of the same Act, they nevertheless continued to conspire to

sell counterfeit drugs through the official website and sales channels such as MOMO, PChome, and Shopee for their own personal gain. Moreover, in order to avoid investigation by prosecutors, police, and administrative authorities, they obtained the IP addresses of Taiwanese government agencies through unknown sources and blocked those IP addresses to prevent law enforcement personnel from accessing Tien o Ai Company's official website to investigate whether they were continuing to sell counterfeit drug products. All of the above products were not removed from sale until December 19, 2024. During this period, however, counterfeit drug products with a total sales value of NT\$1,664,410 had already been sold.

II. Sentencing Recommendation and Confiscation of Criminal Proceeds

On the basis of that the Defendants Zhu o-Qing, Bai o-Wen, and Huang o-Wen, after November 28, 2024, had known that the products "Purifying Extract," "Qi-Nourishing Extract," "Body-Tonic Extract," "Slimming Extract," and "Beauty Extract" were defined as counterfeit drugs under Article 20, Paragraph 1, Subparagraph 1 of the Pharmaceutical Affairs Act, they did not immediately remove them from the market, and continued to sell the above products to consumers. They even established websites in Hong Kong and, under the guise of overseas websites, continued to market and sell the counterfeit drugs within Taiwan. Furthermore, they obstructed investigations by prosecutors, police, and administrative authorities by blocking the IP addresses of government agencies. It is evident that they disregarded the health of the public and continued to sell counterfeit drugs for their own profit.

However, considering that all three defendants have admitted the offenses during the investigation, shown remorse, and surrendered the full amount of criminal proceeds of NT\$1,664,410, it is requested that the court impose appropriate sentences on them, and pursuant to Article 38-1, Paragraph 1 of the Criminal Code, order the confiscation of the criminal proceeds.
